## 2015 NSPS Step 1

- Step 1 requirements
  - Went into effect May 15, 2015.
  - Emissions requirements of 4.5 g/hr or less for both noncatalytic and catalytic woodstoves.
    - Catalyst equipped models (including hybrids) must be shipped with a catalyst temperature sensor.
    - New first one hour test run emissions measurement and filter change.
    - Required efficiency, heat output and carbon monoxide testing and reporting.
  - New permanent labeling requirements.
  - Post Owner's Manual and other information on product website.
    - This includes efficiency, heat output and carbon monoxide values from testing with EPA's test method.

# Step 2

- Step 2 requirements
  - Goes into effect May 2020, five years after Step 1 went into effect.
  - Emissions requirement of 2.0 g/hr for both non-catalytic and catalytic woodstoves.
  - Possible efficiency and CO requirements based on the results obtained from Step 1.

## Manufacturer Challenges

- 60 days to meet NSPS requirements
  - Update all installation instructions with new requirements per model
  - Create and order new labels for each model
  - Update all brochures
  - Submit efficiency and CO data per model for EPA website
  - Update manufacturer's websites with efficiency and CO data per mode

## Pellet Fuel Requirements

- A positive from the NSPS is the requirement of calling out of a graded fuel for the pellet appliance and approved by an approved third party organization.
- Inconsistent and poor quality fuels leads to:
  - Bridging due to inconsistent lengths
  - Clinkers
  - Low heat output
  - Higher cleaning requirements
