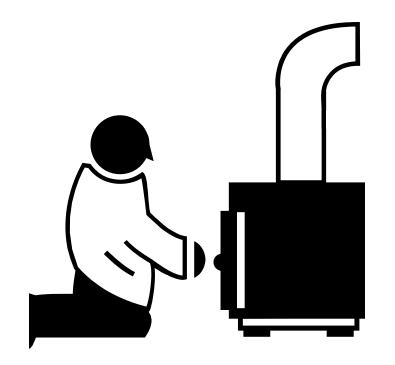

U.S. Hearth Appliance Shipments in 2009

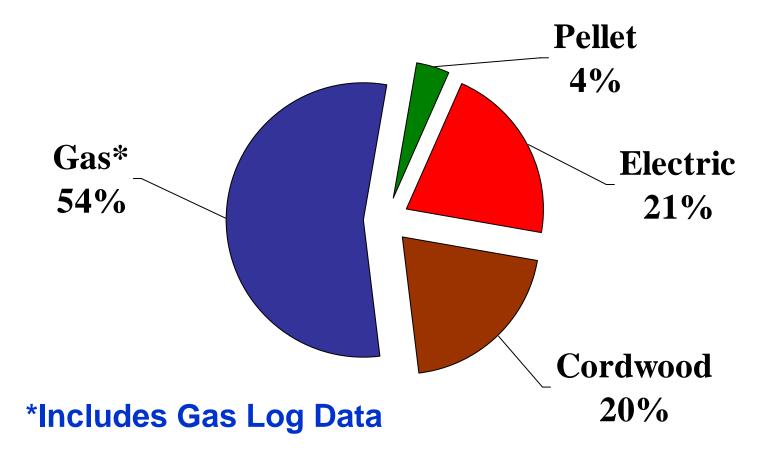


- Cordwood 235,647
 - Gas 635,820
- Electric (N.A.) 245,800
 - <u>Pellet 46,124</u>
 - TOTAL 1,163,391

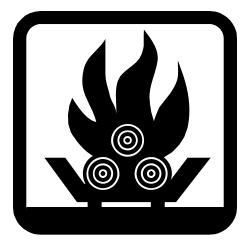
Hearth Appliance Shipments by Type of Fuel -- 2009



Between 2008 and 2009 . . .

- <u>Cordwood</u> appliance shipments decreased 32%
 - From 345,658 to 235,647
- <u>Gas</u> appliance shipments decreased 37%
 - From 1,017,078 to 635,820
- <u>Electric</u> appliance shipments decreased 35%
 - From 378,250 to 245,800
- <u>Pellet</u> appliance shipments decreased 67%
 - From 141,208 to 46,124

Overall, industry decreased 38% between 2008 and 2009



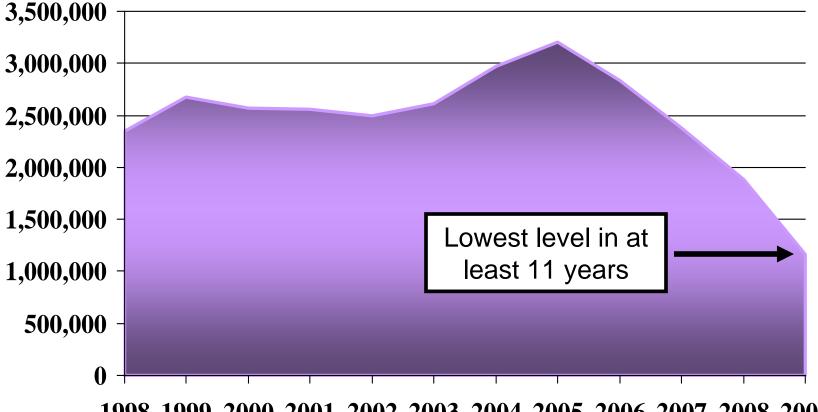
Since 1998 . . .

- <u>Cordwood</u> appliance shipments decreased 64%
 - From 652,500 to 235,647
- <u>Gas</u> appliance shipments decreased 60%
 - From 1,611,750 to 635,820
- <u>Electric</u> appliance shipments increased 392%
 - From 50,000 to 245,800
- <u>Pellet</u> appliance shipments increased 36%
 - From 34,000 to 46,124

Overall, industry decreased 50% between 1998 and 2009

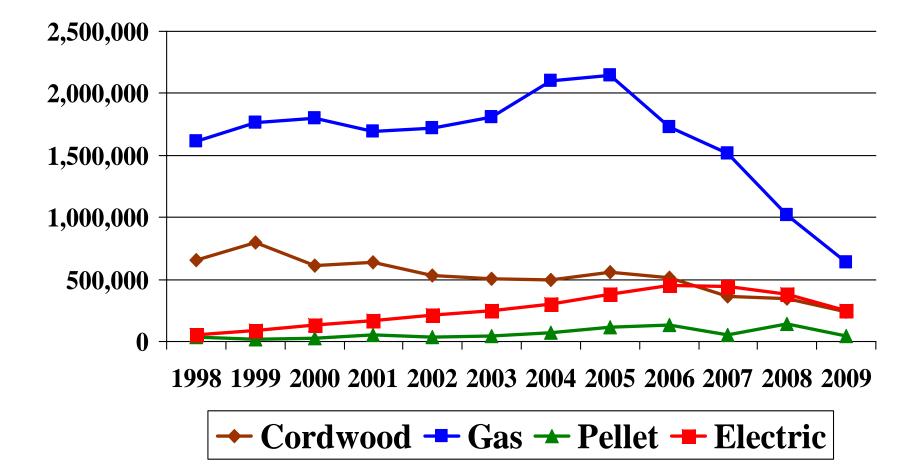


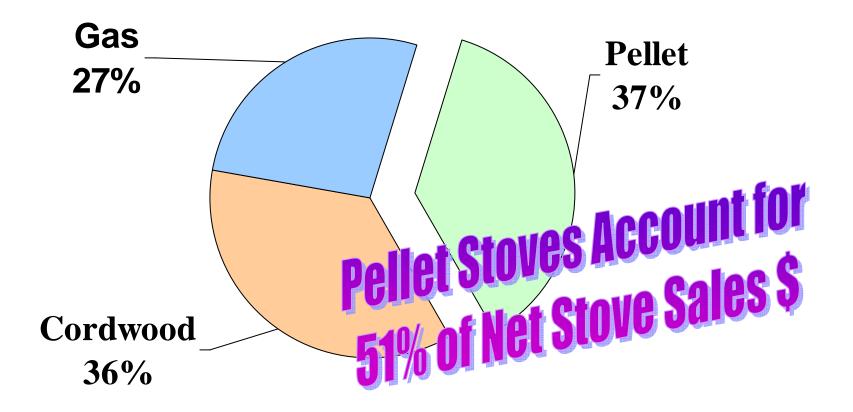


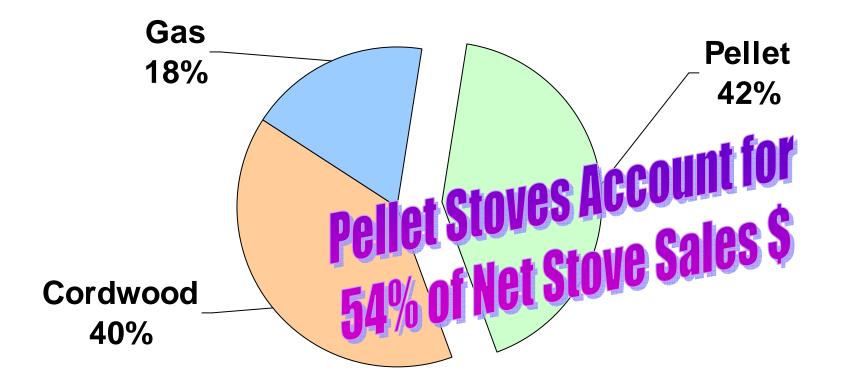


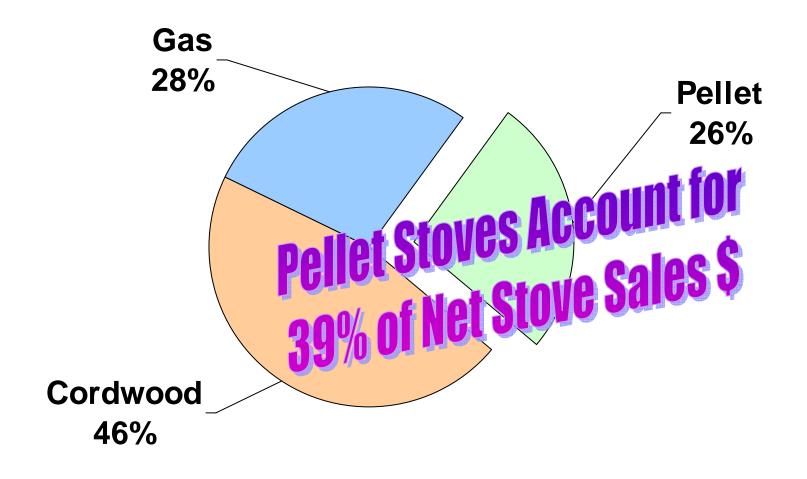

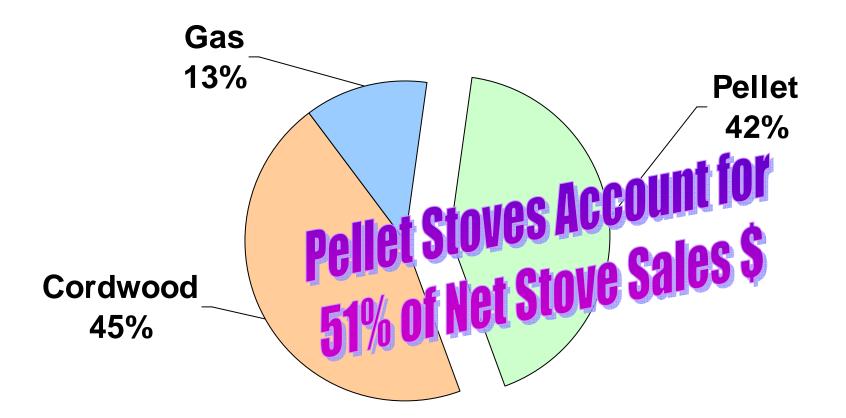
Hearth Appliance Shipments 1998--2009

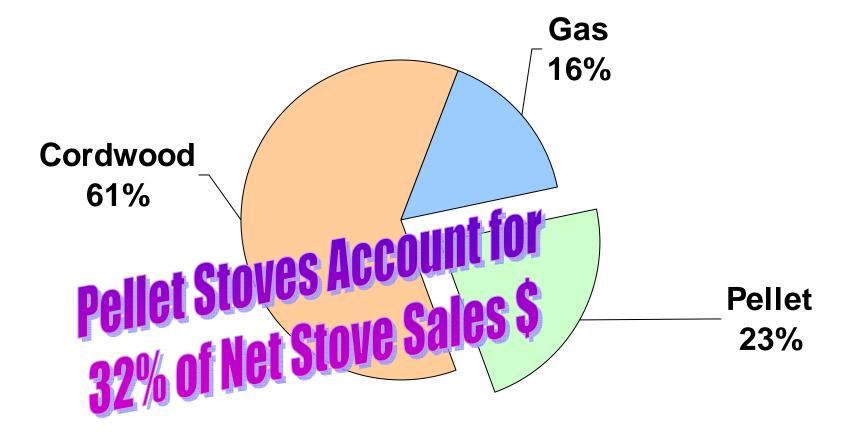




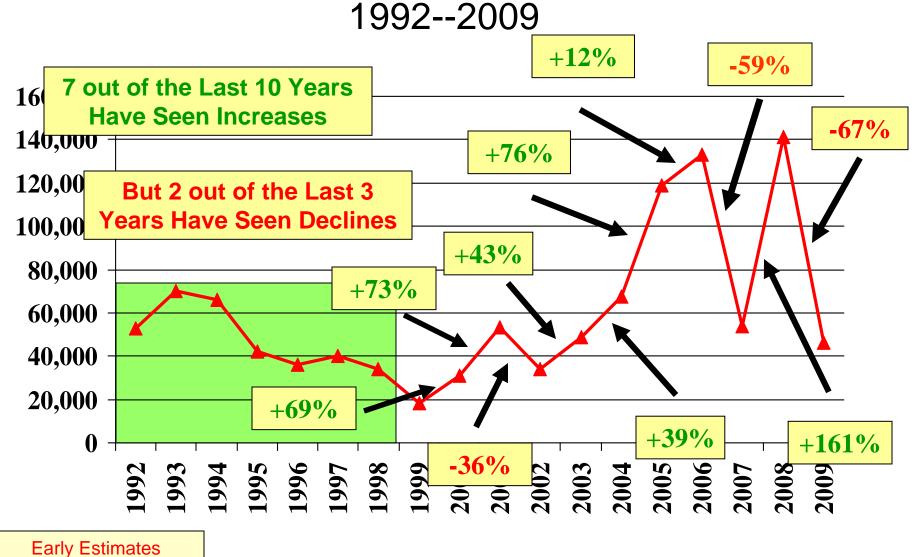






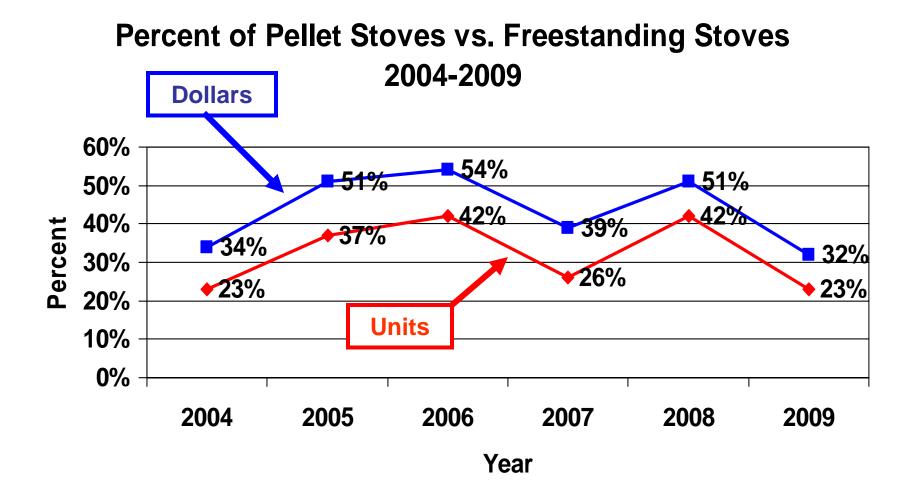


Pellet Appliance Shipments

Pellet Appliance Observations

- Pellet Appliance Shipments and Sales are the most <u>volatile</u> in the hearth industry
- When the consumer views the price of <u>heating their home to be expensive</u>, then sales and shipments dramatically increase
- When the consumer views the price of <u>heating their home to be</u> <u>reasonable</u>, then sales and <u>shipments are much less robust</u>



In 2009, HPBA Started Collecting Data About Central Heating Systems Fueled with Biomass Fuels

- Program started 2Q09
- Two categories collected:
 - Central Heating Systems fueled with Pellets
 - Central Heating Systems fueled with Cordwood/Wood Chips
- Participation levels could have been higher – somewhat disappointing

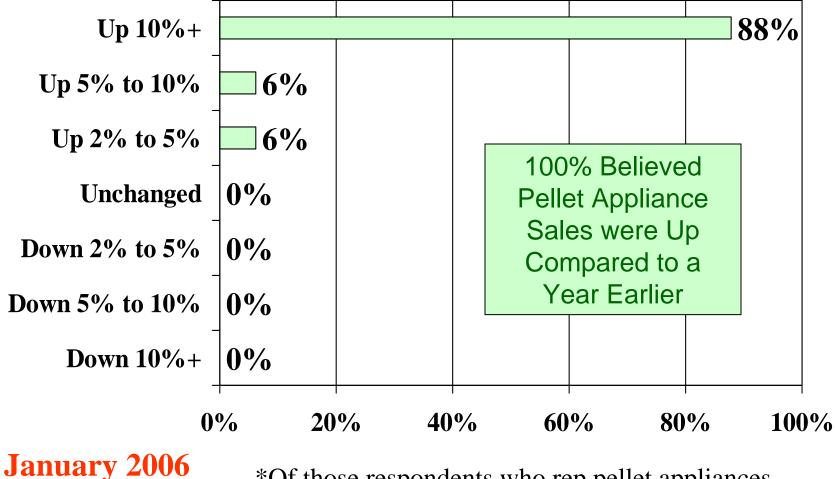

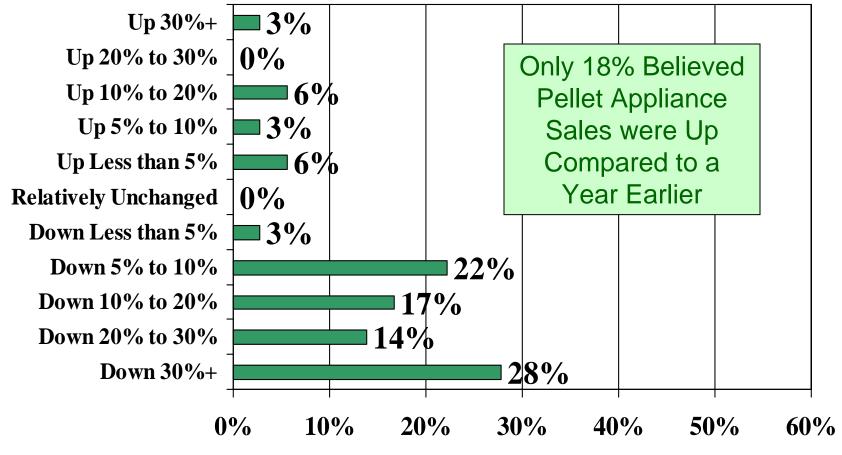
HPBA Manufacturers' Rep Survey



- Conducted quarterly since June 2000 (39 quarters)
- FAXED to HPBA Manufacturing Reps
- Response rates range from 17% to 25% (recently)
- "Leading indicator" for Pellet industry

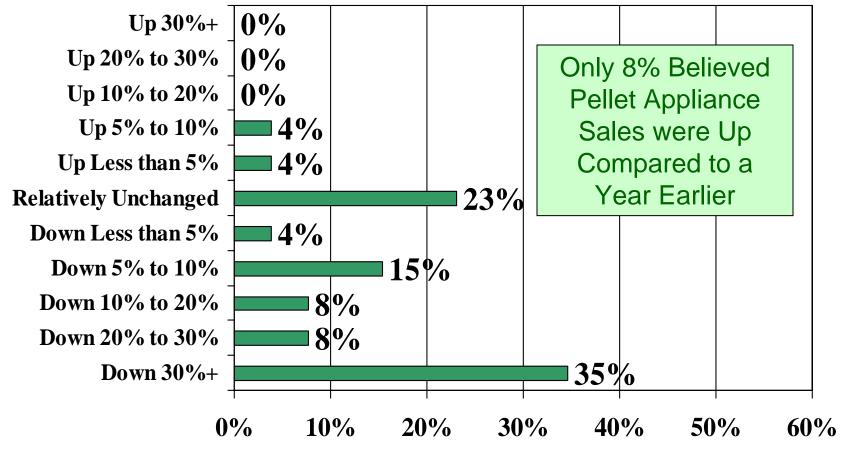

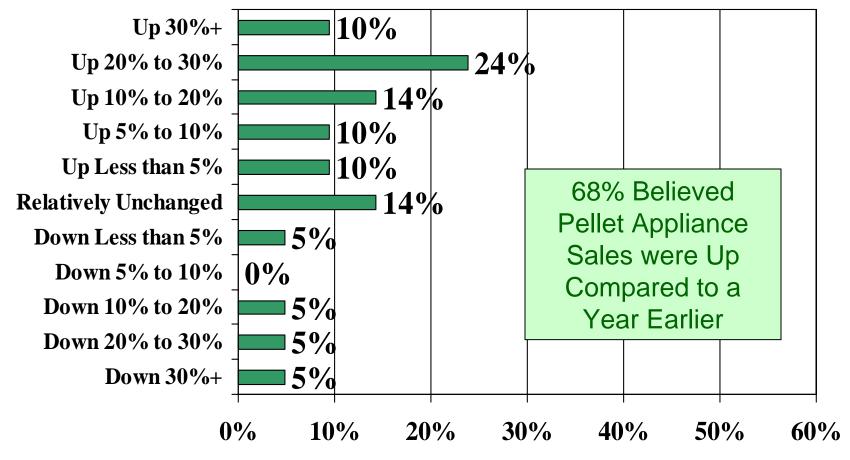
January 2007

*Of those respondents who rep cordwood appliances



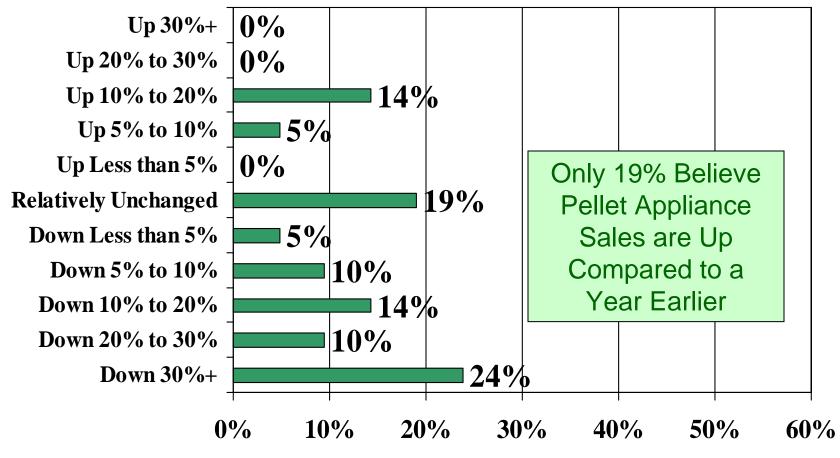
January 2008

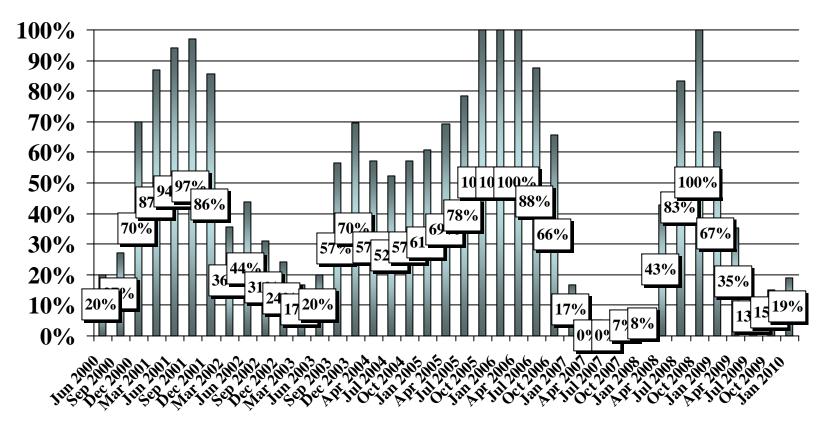
