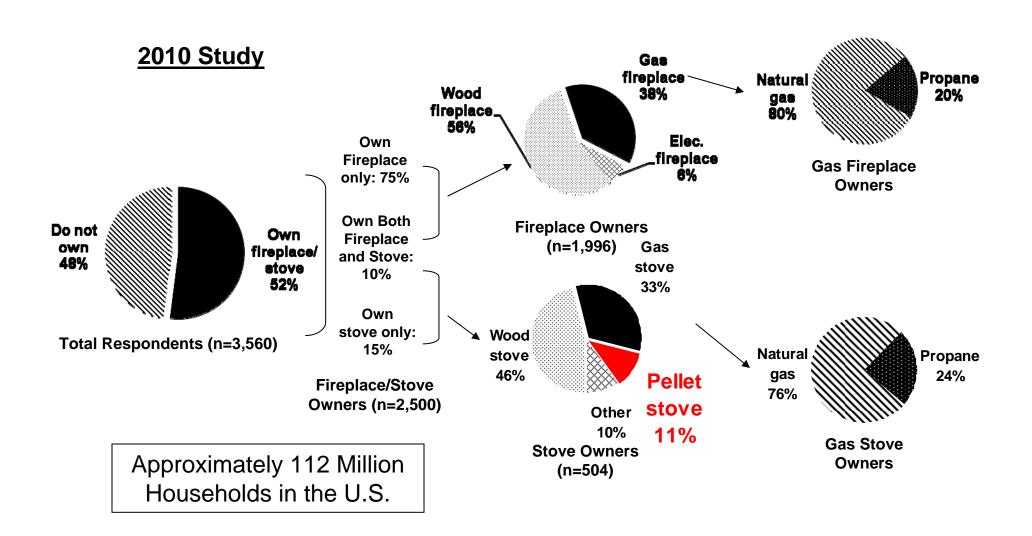

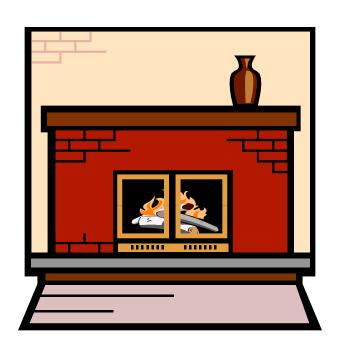
Own Fireplace/Stove in Primary Residence

U.S. Hearth Appliance Shipments in 2010

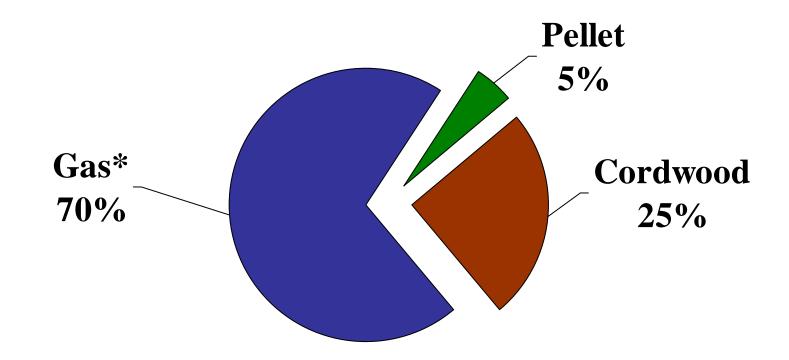


- Cordwood 230,787

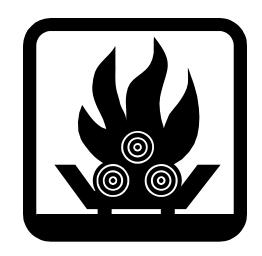

Between 2009 and 2010 . . .

- Cordwood appliance shipments decreased 3%
 - From 236,743 to 230,787
- Gas appliance shipments increased 1%
 - From 643,685 to 650,911
- Pellet appliance shipments decreased 4%
 - From 46,133 to 44,269

Electric hearth appliance shipments increased 16% between 2009 and 2010

Overall, industry Remained Stable between 2009 and 2010



Since 1998 . . .

- Cordwood appliance shipments decreased 65%
 - From 652,500 to 230,787
- Gas appliance shipments decreased 60%
 - From 1,611,750 to 650,911
- Pellet appliance shipments increased 30%
 - From 34,000 to 44,269

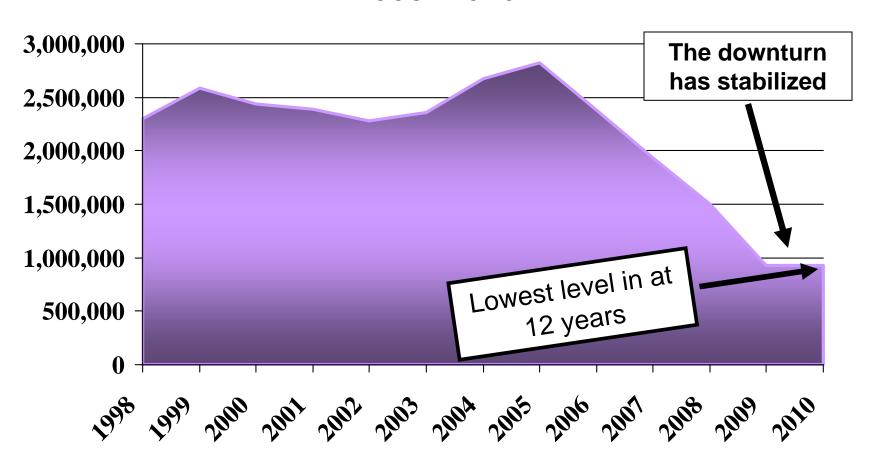

Total U.S. Hearth Appliance Shipments

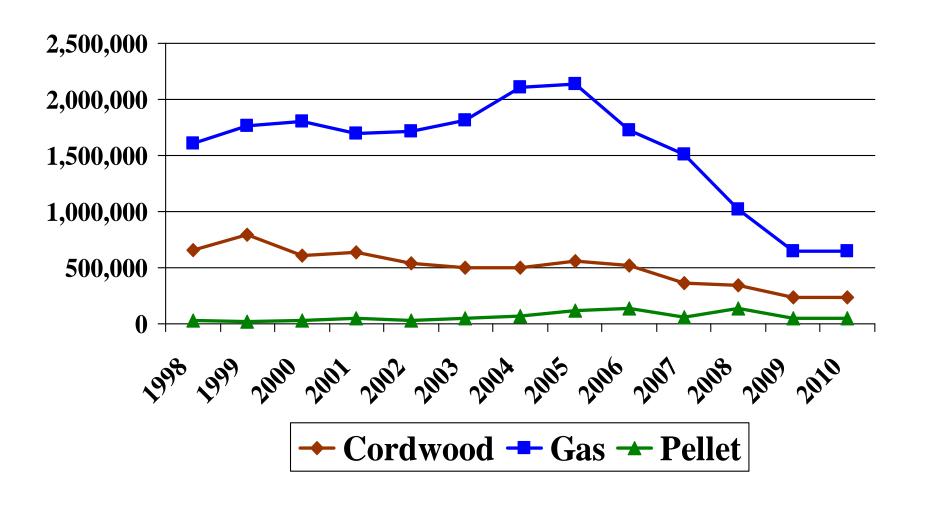

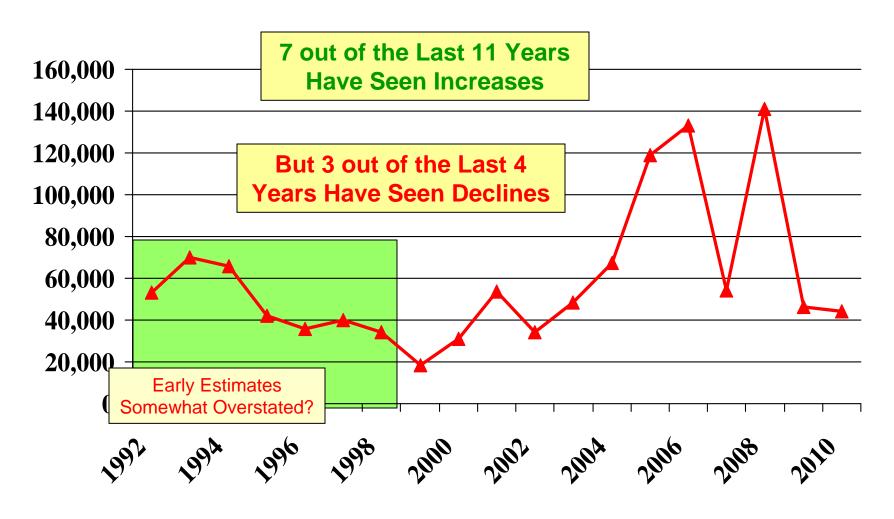

U.S. Hearth Appliance Shipments

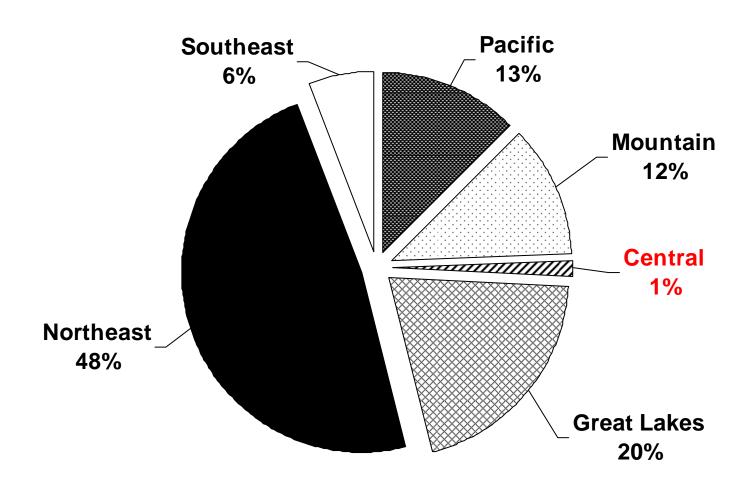

U.S. Pellet Appliance Shipments 1992--2010

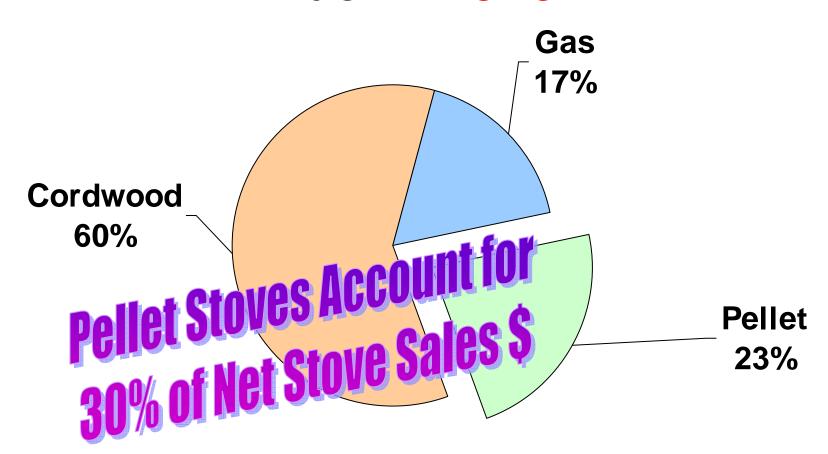


U.S. Pellet Appliance Shipments 2010

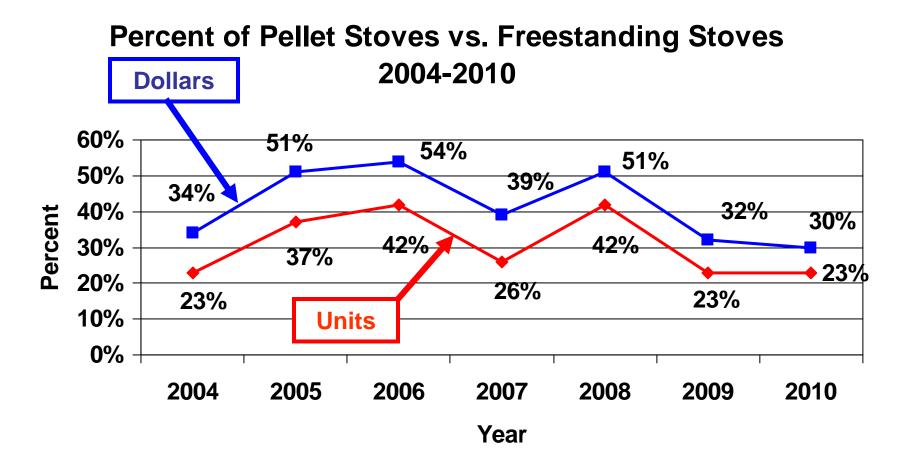


U.S. Freestanding Stove

Pellet Appliance Observations

- Pellet Appliance Shipments and Sales are the most <u>volatile</u> in the hearth industry
- When the consumers view the price of <u>heating their home to be expensive</u>, then sales and shipments dramatically increase
- When the consumers view the price of <u>heating their home to be</u> <u>reasonable</u>, then sales and <u>shipments are much less robust</u>



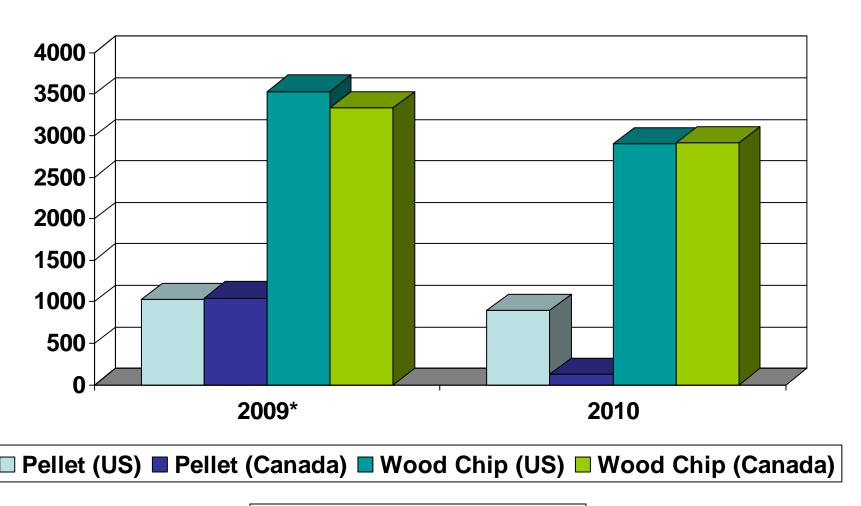


In 2009, HPBA Started Collecting Data About Central Heating Systems Fueled with Biomass Fuels

- Program started 2Q09
- Two categories collected:
 - Central Heating Systems fueled with Pellets
 - Central Heating Systems fueled with Cordwood/Wood Chips



Central Biomass Heating Units Shipped Since April 2009



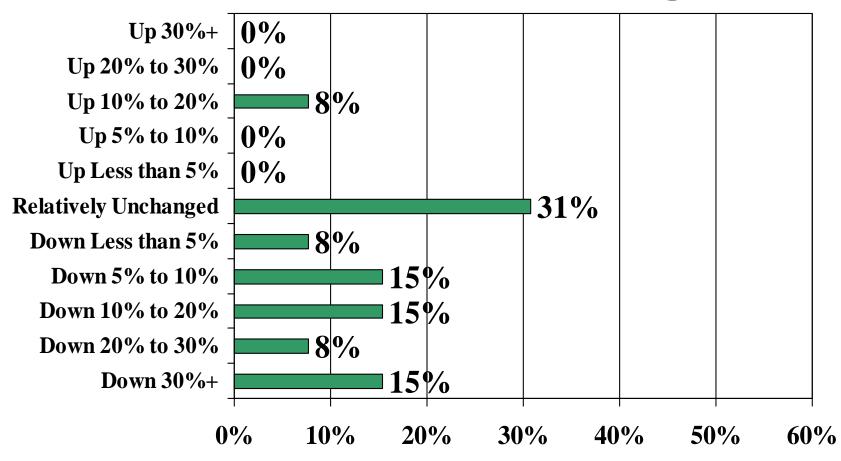

HPBA Manufacturers' Rep Survey



- Conducted quarterly since June 2000 (43 quarters)
- FAXED to HPBA Manufacturing Reps
- Response rates range from 16% to 25% (recently)
- "Leading indicator" for Pellet industry
